

Let's get to know the project!

The YouthPioneer project is a co-funded initiative by the European Social Fund (Social Innovation Initiative) with a duration of two years (December 2024 to December 2026).

It is being implemented in 6 European countries: Italy, Spain, Romania, Bulgaria, Greece, and Cyprus.

Its main goal is to increase the employability of young NEETs by addressing skills gaps in an innovative and collaborative way. Through mentoring, work-based learning, and stakeholder involvement, we empower young people to take an active role in today's evolving economy.

HOW?

- By involving 90 NEET young people in personalised work-based learning pathways tailored to their career aspirations (15 NEETs in each country).
- By providing training and support to young NEETs through a mentoring program and workshops.
- By selecting companies and workplaces committed to training young NEETs.



We are developing Social Innovation through the **YouthPioneer Model** (YPM).


- A multi-actor approach: by involving various stakeholders, including young NEETs, youth organisations, local companies and public authorities. This collaboration pools resources, provides concrete opportunities, and offers significant support and networking for young NEETs.
- A multi-dimensional approach: we build on and expand the results of three successful projects (REBUILD, YOPEVA, StartUp2) and combine a one-toone approach for needs assessment and mentoring, collaborative trainings, work-based learning, project design, and entrepreneurial pitching to comprehensively address the skills development needs of young NEETs.

YouthPioneer aims to serve as a reference point for all future efforts to enhance the employability of young NEETs in Europe. Our multi-level, multidimensional approach provides both macro- and micro-level support that young NEETs need to succeed in the labor market and fully integrate into society.



Palermo: Where everything kicked off with the International Training!

The YouthPioneer journey officially kicked off in Palermo on March 18–19, 2025 with an international training hosted by CESIE. Partners from across Europe came together for two days of dynamic exchange, sharing best practices and building on the successes of REBUILD, YOPEVA, and StartUp2.

This inspiring launch set the tone for YouthPioneer: empowering youth, connecting communities, and shaping opportunities.

Our roundtables have sparked the creation of local networks!

Focusing on June 2025, roundtables were organised across all consortium countries with the participation of local authorities, companies, youth organisations, and civil society representatives. The aim was to build strong local networks through dialogue and knowledge exchange to effectively address the challenges young NEETs face in successfully entering the labor market. The tangible outcome of these successful roundtables was the development of local Action Plans, which define the role and level of involvement of each stakeholder at various stages of the project.



Connecting young NEETs with businesses and the local community

Over 200 people participated in the project's Networking Events across the six YouthPioneer countries. Young NEETs, business representatives, youth organisations, NGOs, and local authorities had the opportunity to meet, discuss their expectations, dreams, and the realities of the world of work and entrepreneurship, and to initiate collaborations that will culminate in work-based learning activities.

Individual sessions to reveal true talents

Between November and December 2025, all one-to-one meetings between young NEETs and the project's youth workers will be completed. These sessions will co-create Individual Plans that reflect the participants' aspirations and outline the steps needed to turn their expectations into reality.

The Skills-Assessment Tool is ready and about to make its debut!

Focusing on eight key soft skill categories, this online tool allows young NEETs to assess their current skill levels, identify areas for improvement, and access educational resources—so that their development begins from the very moment of assessment.

The Project Design Training Programme is set to make a difference!

The training programme has been developed in six languages and will be published shortly. It will also be implemented across all consortium countries, with the participation of qualified trainers and young NEETs.

Work-based Learning: Turning Theory into Action!

With the support of the businesses participating in the project as work-based learning sites, and with the guidance of local community representatives, young NEETs will put their new knowledge into action. They will join everyday professional activities, observe, analyze situations, and design innovative solutions to the challenges each workplace faces—transforming themselves into true YouthPioneers.
